



Sharing the Library

The library becomes powerful when one person can save a useful resource and pass it to someone nearby.

Plain answer

The goal is not only access. The goal is repeatable sharing: one person receives, understands, saves, and passes the resource forward.

Field steps

1. Connect or copy - Use VillageServer Wi-Fi, microSD, USB, or phone sharing to get one resource onto the first device.
2. Choose one useful file - Pick the file most likely to help immediately: Scripture, audio, a film, or a training PDF.
3. Save it clearly - Put it in a folder or app the person can find again.
4. Share to one person - Use the simplest nearby transfer method for the two phones.
5. Ask the new person to repeat - Have the receiver share it again so the method becomes local knowledge.
6. Leave printed steps - Use the handout so sharing continues after the team leaves.

Key points

What to share first: One file that is clearly useful, not the whole library.

Who should learn: A local person who is patient and likely to teach others.

What to avoid: Complicated folder names, too many files, and unexplained apps.

Board takeaway: Sharing turns a kit into a multiplying access path.

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Field habit: do one small test first. Open one file, confirm it works offline, then teach the next person to repeat it.
