Plain answer

Use LocalSend or a computer/USB path when AirDrop and Quick Share cannot talk to each other.

Field steps

1. Put both devices on one network - Use VillageServer Wi-Fi or another local Wi-Fi network if LocalSend is used.
2. Open LocalSend - Install or open LocalSend on both devices when available.
3. Send one file - Choose one resource on the iPhone and send it to the Android device.
4. Save clearly - On Android, save it to Downloads or a named ministry folder.
5. Confirm offline access - Open the file after mobile data is off or unavailable.

Key points

Best use: Use this handout when this exact device route is in front of you.

First test: Move one small file before moving a whole folder.

Offline check: Confirm the received file opens without mobile data.

Teach-back: Ask the receiving person to repeat the transfer.
